What is Pucallpa? Is it an exotic food, an unknown insect, just what is it? Pucallpa is a city in eastern Peru located on the banks of the Ucayali River, a major tributary of the Amazon. On Sunday, Dennis and Bob, a co-worker, flew to Pucallpa for two weeks. From there they traveled by road to a partnering organization's center to do a maintenance technical evaluation for Jammer, a Peruvian national. One of the major challenges has been Jammer's English. Dennis is requesting prayer for wisdom and keen insight in all he does and that he would be a blessing to the group there. His return to Waxhaw will be February 12.

The center is located on a lake that is currently very high due to rainy season so the house where he is staying (built on stilts) is totally over the water. Dennis is really enjoying the nice, warm, and humid weather since it has been years since he slept and worked in a jungle setting.

Once Dennis returns to Waxhaw he has two weeks to prepare for the 2011 Spring Orientation, so this month is full. Please pray for safe travel and this time of separation, internet connectivity is limited.



The child safety class I taught last Thursday went well and the new curriculum is very interactive. There was excellent participation. I had numerous people tell me that if they had only known as a child what we are teaching in child safety they could have avoided being abused. I teach another class Feb 23 and will begin standardized testing for homeschoolers next week this will continue until the end of March.

Thank you for standing together with us to reach the Bibleless peoples through aviation training, child safety, and education. We are grateful to God for your faithfulness.
