You begin walking before first light and walk hard all day long. Then you spend the night in a small village in the bush. You awaken early to spend the second day walking up and down rough trails in the mountainous rainforest of Papua New Guinea.

For the Onobasulu people in Walagu village, this is the only way to get to the nearest road.

“You would never make it,” the Onobasulu man told translator Beverly Mosley. Beverly smiled and answered, “That is right. That is why the JAARS airplane brings me and picks me up.”

This spring orientation, Dennis has had the opportunity to invest in two men that are going to Papua New Guinea to serve translators like Beverly. Mike will be serving as a pilot mechanic and Dan will serve as an aviation mechanic.



I have taught eight child safety classes since November. Thank you for your prayers for these presentations. I will be teaching another class on June 15 to the 30 people who still need training and another class to a group of new members in August.

I'm working with three families who have special educational needs for their children. All are working to find appropriate answers for those needs.

We praise God for you. Your partnership through your prayers and giving make it possible for translators like Beverly to reach people groups around the world. You help equip people to reach the waiting 2,000 people groups.
